The Rajyotsava celebration at New Horizon Public School was not merely an event, it was a tribute, an ode, and a glowing reflection of Karnataka's timeless culture and our school's unwavering commitment to excellence.

## ANDAMAN DIARIES

Some trips stay with you long after you return. My journey to the Andaman Islands was not just about beaches or sight seeing — it was about living with nature, breathing in the ocean air, and realizing how peaceful life can be away from the city noise. Those five days were one of the best days of my life. How it all started was that me and my parents were arguing about where to go for a trip as we had not travelled for a long time. My father wanted to stay at home, my mother wanted to go to Kashmir but I wanted to go to some beach. We had visited Goa many times so we did not want to go there again. We thought of going to Pondicherry or Mumbai but then since we had to come back soon, it was not possible. And then the idea of going to one of the Indian islands struck my father. After a lot of research, we decided to go to the Andamans that too only the south of it as in the north there are many restrictions due to the existence of the tribes.

We started our journey on the 24<sup>th</sup> of September from Bangalore International Airport. We had a direct Air India flight from Bangalore to Port Blair (Veer Savarkar Airport). Day 1(Port Blair): We first went to our resort and had a small break. We then visited the Cellular Jail. It was huge. There are two lamps which burns 24/7 365 days, one dedicated to all the freedom fighters and one specially dedicated to Veer Savarkar for his leadership and contribution towards the freedom of the people locked in the jail. Our guide explained us that the people were brought here without them knowing and these people were key freedom fighters who were about to bring a freedom revolution and since British government could not control them in the mainland they were sent here. They wore clothes made of poor-quality fabric, they used to get 100 grams of porridge 3 times a day so that they stay weak and sea water to drink. We then saw the jail rooms which were 10 feet tall and 7 feet wide. They were very dark and had only one grilled opening on the top through which sunlight used to enter. We then saw the room in which they were galloped and when the lever was pulled the people were hanged 8 feet above the ground. The guide then told us that every morning the locked people were given tasks like taking out 30 gallons of oil from the coconuts manually which was very hard and it was the work which was usually done by a bull and even it could not complete 15 gallons per day. If they failed to do so, then they used to get lashings which were very painful.

We then went to the Corbyn's Cove Beach. It was dark even though it was only 5 in the evening. My sister and I had a lot of fun playing in the water. We then came back to the jail as there was a 'Light and Sound' show. They explained the whole story of how the Britishers treated the Indians, how they made them do all the painful work and how our freedom fighters escaped the terrible life of the Cellular jail. We then went back to our resort, had our dinner, and went to bed. Day 2(Havelock Island): The next morning, we woke up, took a bath, and went for breakfast. After that, we quickly left for the jetty as we had to take a cruise to our next destination, Havelock Island. We travelled on a cruise named Makrizz, which was an excellent experience, though quite cold. The journey took about two hours, and we all reached safely. After checking into our resort, we had lunch and then went to Radha Nagar Beach. However, we could not do any activities as it was raining heavily, so we returned to the resort and enjoyed our stay in the room playing games Day 3(Havelock Island): The next day, we went to Elephant Beach by speed boat, as it is separated from Havelock Island. We did many activities there, such as snorkelling, dragon rides, pencil rides, sofa, jet skiing and more. After these activities we were drenched so we changed our clothes and had Maggi and chats from the nearby stalls. Even though it was only 4 in the evening we had to leave the Elephant beach as it comes under the reserve forest area and it had started to rain.
