STUDENT CORNER

LEARNING THAT LASTS

Every student wants to do well, and most of us believe the way to get there is to sit with our books for as long as we can. We read a chapter, read it again, mark the important lines in bright colours, and close the book feeling satisfied. Yet a week later, when the question paper is in front of us, much of what we read has quietly disappeared. The problem is rarely a lack of effort. More often, it is the method.

Reading something again and again feels productive. The words become familiar, the ideas seem clear, and familiarity is easily mistaken for knowledge. However recognising an answer when it is printed in front of you is very different from producing the same answer from an empty page, and it is always the second skill that an examination asks for.

Researchers who study memory have found something surprising. When students close their books and try to recall what they have learnt, they remember far more in the long run than those who simply read the same material repeatedly. The effort of pulling an answer out of one's own mind strengthens memory in a way that passive reading never does. Timing matters too. Memory fades quickly at first, and each time we revisit a topic just as it begins to fade, it becomes a little more permanent. Learning spread across several days is far stronger than the same hours spent in one long night.

These methods do not feel pleasant. Testing yourself is tiring, and the blank moments are discouraging, but that struggle is not a sign of failure. It is the very process by which learning becomes lasting. As students, you can begin with small changes. Before opening a textbook, write down everything you already remember, and let the gaps guide your revision. Write your notes as questions, cover the answers, and work through them. Attempt past papers early, while you are still making mistakes. Return to each subject briefly across the term rather than only on the night before. None of this requires more hours, only a different use of the hours you already give.

Good study habits are built slowly, through patient efforts repeated over weeks and months. We may not be able to change the pressure of examinations, but we can change the way we approach them. By choosing understanding over memorisation, patience over panic, and honest effort over comfortable routine, we can make our learning something that stays with us. With the mid-term exams approaching fast, wishing you all the best for your preparations and of course, the exams.
